

Dear Parents/Guardians

I am pleased to enclose your son/daughter's second Interim Report. This provides a snapshot of his/her performance and progress over the last few weeks.

This Report includes the current predicted grade for each subject as well as grades for motivation, class ethic and time management. As always, if you have any concerns about the Report please contact the College and we will arrange for you to meet a member of our management team. For a few students we will be requesting that such a meeting takes place.

Attendance

You may be aware that we are now sending an email each Friday containing a weekly register to any parents/guardians of students whose adjusted attendance falls below 90% that week. Adjusted attendance refers to the number of lessons they have attended, but is adjusted up to include any absences that the College has authorised.

Examination/Course Entry Status

Every student starts off the year with 'entry' status in all subjects. If their performance remains acceptable, this status will be maintained and they will be entered for their examinations and/or their final coursework submission, with the College paying the examination or entry fees. If a student's performance is unacceptable, then regrettably their status will be changed to 'non-entry'. It will then be up to them to prove through hard work and regular attendance that the status should be changed back to 'entry'. Any student who has 'non-entry' status in late April 2017 will not be able to sit the subject(s) concerned at Reigate College in the summer. If your son/daughter has had their entry status changed, you will be informed and have the opportunity to come into College to discuss the situation.

Mock exams

Most (but not all) AS and A Level subjects will be conducting internal mock exams during January. Information about the arrangements for these mock exams has already been circulated. For some subjects the mocks might take place either before or after January. Whilst these exams are internal, the mock exams will provide students, parents and teachers with a clear indication of progress so far and we will use the results to inform grades on the third Interim Report. Therefore, it is essential that your son/daughter prepares thoroughly for these assessments.
