- Reigate College continues to be ranked in the Top 10 of all UK Colleges using success rates as the criteria.
- Its National Teaching School status means it is recognised across the country for exceptional leadership, training and performance.
- Reigate College's students continue to out-perform national quidelines for predicted grades based on GCSE results. The 2017 cohort was expected to achieve 1,215 high grades (A* to B). They actually received an incredible 3,939 high grades, over three times the national prediction.
- Last summer's A Level pass rate was 99.2%, up from 99.1% in 2016.
- In BTECs there was yet again a 100% pass rate in 2017, with 97.5% of the Diplomas (the equivalent of 2 A Levels) Distinction or Distinction*, putting Reigate College among the top BTEC providers in the country.

- Reigate College is one of the largest providers of students to UK universities in the country, with over 700 students accepting university offers in 2017.



History Successes

Stephanie Earnshaw and Layla Kharroubi won places on the Lessons from Auschwitz Project. Both are hoping to continue studying History with Stephanie having been offered a place at Goldsmiths, University of London (History), and Layla at Leeds (International History and Politics).

Essays by History students Teddy Wyrley-Birch (on "Trump: Revolution or reaction?") and Miranda Evans (on Monarchy in the Middle Ages) were submitted for the Vellacot History Award run by Peterhouse College, Cambridge.

Extended Project Qualifications (EPQs)

EPQs offer high-achieving students a fantastic opportunity to deepen their knowledge in an area of particular interest to them. Their final submission can take many forms including a university style dissertation, composition or piece of artwork.

Here are some of this year's projects:

- Marcus Thorpe: To what extent is it possible to design a 3D print, low cost, biometric prosthetic hand that can be used in low GDP countries? As part of his EPQ, Marcus actually designed and built a 3D model.
- James Saw: What impact is the development of self-learning AI likely to have on modern warfare and what issues does its use raise for wider
- Jake Coates: To what extent did the Wars of the Roses have a significant impact on the development of the political system of England up until 1509?

This year's high-achieving students have once again been receiving offers from all the top Russell Group universities. This is due at least partly to the College's 'Aspire University Pathway', that ensures students receive targeted advice and support via a schedule of additional weekly seminars.

The 'Aspire University Pathway' includes the following additional forms of support:

- Additional Qualifications, such as the EPQ (see left)
- Oxbridge Support
- Specific Enrichment Activities, including the Law Society and MVD Society
- General Enrichment Activities, including DofE Gold, Debating and Shares 4 Schools
- Work Experience opportunities (see page 21)

The College also runs the 'Aspire Employability Pathway' which is designed to provide tailored information and quidance to students interested in exploring alternatives to the traditional university routes.

- In January, over a hundred prospective students attended the Aspire Law event where speakers included Anne Rodell, Associate Professor at the University of Law in Guildford
- Also in January four lawyers from the Redhill branch of Morrisons Solicitors gave a seminar on Routes into Law to College students
- The University of Law has delivered a wide-ranging series of talks exploring topics such as presenting skills, the Oscar Pistorius case and writing a successful personal application.

Students also had the opportunity to attend a skills and insight day with Taylor Wessing, a workshop from Allen & Overy, and periods of work experience and shadowing at Irwin Mitchell and Morrisons Solicitors.

This input has really paid off with forty students now off to study Law at university. For some, this is a continuation of studying A Level or BTEC Law at College, such as:

From September, prospective lawyers will be able to benefit from the College's progression agreement with the University of Law (see page 22).






