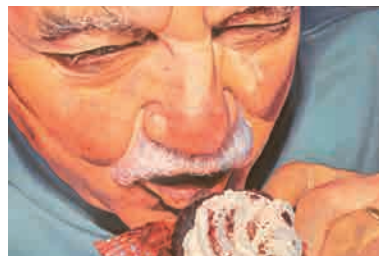

Summer Results 2021

In-line with previous years, the College's 2021 results were once again tremendous, with all but a handful of students securing places at their first-choice universities.

- For A Level, 67.4% of students received high grades (A* to B), with a 99% pass rate overall.
- For BTEC, 68% of students received high grades (Distinction*/Distinction). This figure was well above the national average and is particularly encouraging since students are now required to sit externally assessed exams, bringing the BTEC courses even further in-line with A Levels.

Destinations Headlines

- Over 850 students took up university places in 2021, with 10 students gaining places at either Oxford or Cambridge and 10 securing places to read Medicine or Veterinary Science.
- Overall, in 2021, 30% of students who applied to university secured places at

the top Russell group universities, where students are now studying a range of competitive courses such as Law and PPE.

- In 2022, 1,104 students applied for university, including 112 former students.
- The Aspire Programme (see page 4) continues to grow, supporting students with applications for the most competitive courses and universities.
- Many students benefitted from the College's links with higher education providers (see page 3).
- The College's tutorial programme has helped students reach their preferred next step, whether that's university, apprenticeship or employment. Please see page 25 for an Apprenticeships update.

Oxbridge Success

The 10 Reigate College students who went to Oxford and Cambridge in 2021 continue to offer support to current students on the Aspire Programme, and of our 2022 leavers, a further 11 students have been offered places:

Oxford:

Édua Borbély (Queen's: PPE), Isabelle Haywood (Christ Church: PPE), Lincoln Hewitt (Magdalen: Law), Asma Issa (Christ Church: English) and Alice Northover (Magdalen: Classics II).

Cambridge:

Yosef Abdelhalim (Corpus Christi: Law), Laura Dampier (Queens': Maths with Physics), Lili Finch (Murray Edwards: Maths), Gemma Heathcote (Peterhouse: Classics), Martha Shaylor (Downing HSPS), Tabitha Wren (Peterhouse: ASNC).

Ellen Walkinshaw, Associate Director of Progression at the College, who also heads the College's Aspire Programme said, "It's great to see that within the group of 11, there are several 'first generation' university students and students who meet other widening participation criteria."

MVD Successes

Maths Challenge

Lower Sixth student Gemma Heinrich was the College's overall top scorer in the British Mathematical Olympiad. Maths Teacher David Neuman, who oversees the College's entries said, "Gemma's score of 112 is the highest I've ever seen at the College."

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

252 students were entered for an EPQ in the academic year 2021-2 and through it, were able to deepen their knowledge of an area of personal interest and develop vital independent research skills. Not all students had received their results, at the time of going to print. See page 9 for more information.

For 2021 leavers, 81% achieved an A*- A for their EPQ, and by doing so, many received lower university offers.

Outreach and Widening Participation Programmes

- Sam Murphy (Medicine), Josh Murphy (Business), Evee Berry (Law) and

Kamarie Williams (Law) were accepted by the Social Mobility Foundation's Aspiring Professionals Programme www.socialmobility.org.uk/programmes/ that aims to give them the support needed for entry into top professions

- Over 30 students successfully applied for masterclasses and summer schools at various universities, including Corpus Christi and Lucy Cavendish Colleges at Cambridge and for the UNIQ applicant support programme with Oxford University
- Several students were also accepted onto the Migrant Leaders Programme (see page 23)

Script-writing Success

Upper Sixth Joseph Critchlow was long-listed (from over 400 entries) for the script-writing competition 'New Views Festival 2022' run by the National Theatre.

Joseph's script, "Asphodel – Just a Lonely Dream" was produced through the Playwriting activity, offered as part of the College's Activities Programme (see page 18).

Partnerships

The College's partnership and progression agreements with selected universities have assisted students in obtaining offers from top universities. Current partnerships include:

- Exeter University: guaranteed offers to all Reigate College applicants (other than for some capped courses)
- University of Law: Two scholarships available to students that meet certain widening participation criteria; progression events; annual College prize for achievement in Law
- University of Creative Arts: UCA talks/ workshops on careers in specific industries; guaranteed conditional offer if students meet the entry requirements
- Reigate College is also on the list of aspiring state schools and colleges whose students qualify for contextual offers from Bristol University, that are two grades lower than other applicants

Aspire Programme

The College's Aspire Programme is designed to help more able students apply successfully for courses at the most competitive universities (including Russell Group universities such as Oxbridge). This is achieved through a combination of:

- An additional weekly tutorial with an Aspire tutor
- The opportunity to take additional qualifications such as an EPQ (see page 9)
- Specific enrichment activities such as the Politics Society, History Extra Group, Debating/TED Society

- Talks from visiting speakers
- The opportunity to participate in external events such as Corpus Christi Masterclasses

This is in addition to the support given to all students by the Careers Department (see page 24).

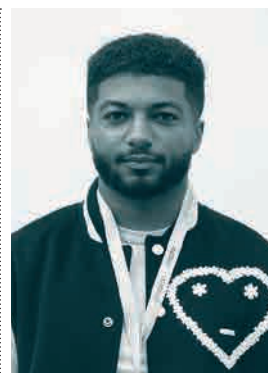

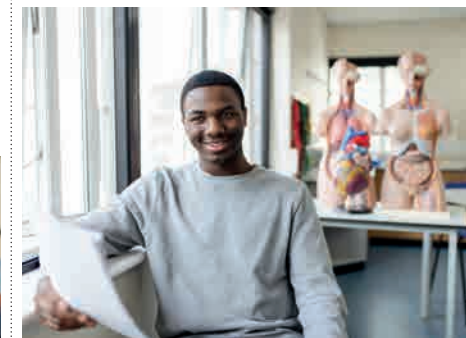
Students take on the role of a trauma doctor and dissect real animal specimens, with the guidance of an experienced human anatomist, at the annual Operating Live event.

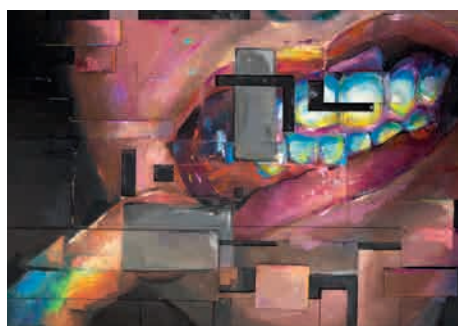

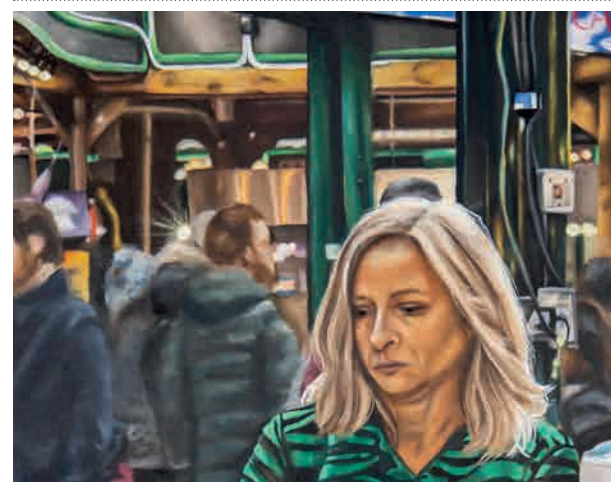

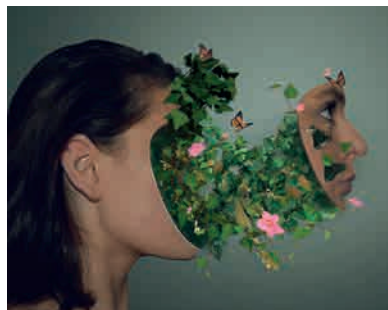

Extended Project Qualifications (EPQ)

Students on the College's Aspire Programme are invited to do an EPQ, as an additional qualification, from the beginning of their Lower Sixth.

The EPQ gives students the opportunity to explore an area of specific interest to them (as an extended essay, artefact or field study), that's maybe only loosely connected to their A Level (or equivalent) courses. The only requirement is that they select an area they are passionate about, as the qualification requires working independently, in much the same way as is expected at university.

We are currently waiting for around half of the final results for 2022, but at the time of going to print, so far:

- Sam Vellacott has achieved full marks for his astonishingly brilliant card game *Three Li'l Birdies*. Sam's imaginative approach and the quality of his prototype, pave the way for him doing exceptionally well on his Primary Education course at Durham University from September.
- Leon Patey and Millie Wells both achieved astonishing scores of 53/54.
- Kiran Patel produced a prototype for an ingenious solar panel that converts wasted, excess heat, to useful electrical energy.

Virtual Work Experience


In the absence of opportunities for in-person work experience, for the last two years the College has worked with various organisations to provide virtual work experience. These include:

Previous School: Carrington
Subjects: BTECs in Law, Information Technology, Business
Apprenticeship: IT Fidelity, Tech Hub Analyst

How did you hear about your apprenticeship?
Bradley: I heard about it through Unifrog, the progression platform we have access to, through the College's Careers service. We spent time researching career options through this during weekly Tutor periods.

What will your apprenticeship cover?
B: The Tech Hub Analyst Apprenticeship focuses on the provision of IT services to employees, for example by sharing troubleshooting tips, creating 'how to' guides and organising Tech Hub drop-in sessions.

Why have you chosen this route over university?
B: I know I'm the kind of person who prefers learning 'on the job'. I also like the idea of earning a salary while I'm learning.

Luke Jetten
Previous School: Oasis Academy, Coulsdon
Subjects: A Levels in Maths, Computer Science, Economics
Apprenticeship: JP Morgan, Digital Tech Solutions, Sponsored Degree Programme

How did you find out about your apprenticeship scheme?
Luke: I found out about them through College Tutor sessions.

What will be the focus of your apprenticeship?
L: It'll focus on Software Development/Engineering but it also covers areas such as Cyber Security, Network Engineering and Data Analysis. It lasts for four years and then most apprentices are taken on as employees.

What are the advantages of doing an apprenticeship?
L: I like the idea of training alongside professionals already in the industry. Also, the 'earn while you learn' model means I won't have to worry about student debt.

Subjects: A Levels in Law, Business, Psychology
Apprenticeship: Cripps Pemberton and Greenis, Paralegal Apprenticeship

How did you hear about the Law apprenticeship?
Adam: It was through my Law teacher Ray Caramba-Coker. He recommended it, as a previous student had done it, and he knew I didn't want to go to university.

How will the apprenticeship work?
A: My apprenticeship is split in to two parts. I'll spend the first two years training to be a paralegal, after that, if I'm successful I'll be eligible to spend a further four years doing training to become a Solicitor.

Why have you chosen an apprenticeship route?
A: I'm more of a practical learner, so I know learning on the job will suit me better, plus you get paid while you're doing it, which is a big plus, compared to university.

Examples of other students recently choosing apprenticeships over university include: Amy Ruffhead (Marketing, Channel 4), Angel Allan (Architecture Degree Apprenticeship APT works Ltd), Jamie Newton (LLB Degree Apprenticeship, CMS Law), Charlotte Cable (Business, Unilever), Ellena Saunders (Digital Marketing, New College of the Humanities).

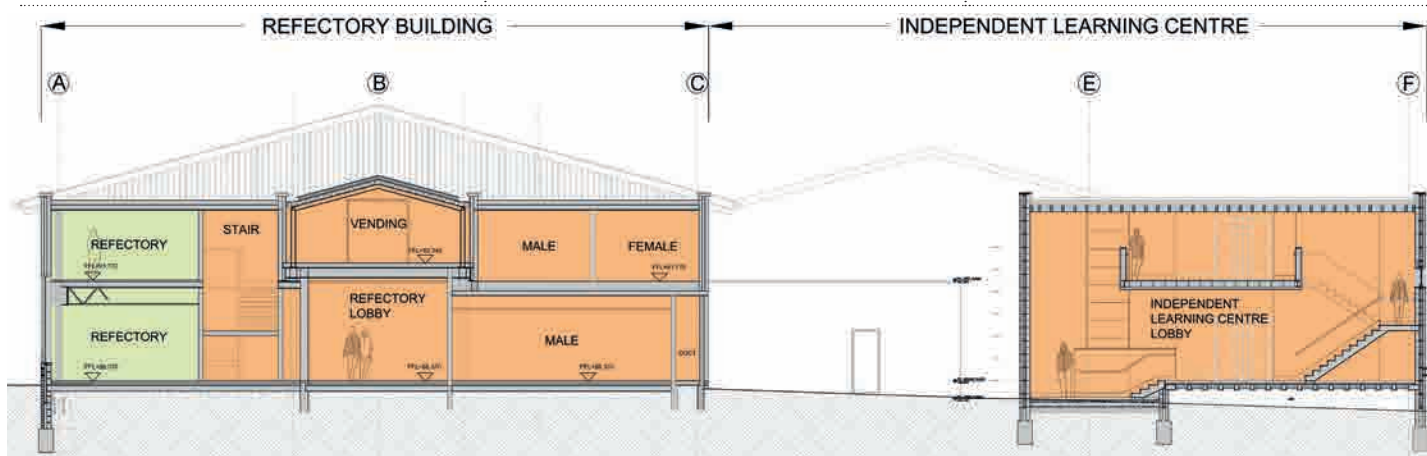
