Widening Participation

Over 35 students have taken part in a range of programmes that support students applying to competitive universities from under-represented (widening participation) backgrounds.

These opportunities have included:

Oxford University's UNIQ programme, Sutton Trust Summer Schools, Lucy Cavendish College (Cambridge) Academic Enrichment Programme, ClickCambridge (applicant support programme), Apply Cambridge, Christ's College Cambridge Women in Maths residential

Summer Results Headlines 2022

The College's 2022 results were extremely impressive, with all but a handful of students securing places at their first-choice universities.

- 124 students achieved three or more A* or A grades at A Level
- 20 students achieved four or more A* or A grades at A Level
- 35% of entries were awarded an A or A* at A Level
- Nearly a quarter of all Level 3 BTEC grades were awarded a Distinction* (equivalent to A* at A Level)
- Thomas Burke received the highest result in the country for A Level Chemistry (Salters)
- Nine students secured places at either Oxford or Cambridge in 2022 (see right) and ten have received offers in 2023 (see page 5)

University Destinations 2022

- 838 students gained places at their first-choice universities.
- Nearly 300 students took up places at Russell Group and Sutton Trust (highly competitive) universities. The top five most popular destinations were:
 - Bristol (38 students)
 - Exeter (30 students)
 - Cardiff (23 students)
 - Nottingham (18 students)
 - Leeds (14 students)

MVD Successes

The Medicine, Veterinary Science and Dentistry (MVD) Programme continues to help students secure places on these incredibly competitive courses. 19 students were offered places in 2023 (see page 8).

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

2022 leavers: 250 students were entered, 70.4% gained A*-A, 88.8% gained A*-B
2023 leavers (at the time of going to print, we only have the results from the January cohort): 136 students were entered, 77.9% gained A*-A

Maths Challenges

The College took part in two Maths Challenges in the last academic year, both organised by the UK Mathematics Trust:

- Mathematical Olympiad for Girls. Gemma Heinrich received a Distinction, (the highest possible award) for her outstanding mark of 50 out of a possible 50. Only 40 girls across the country achieved this perfect score.
- UK Maths Challenge. Of the 55 Reigate College students who entered this year's UK Maths Challenge, 12 achieved Gold Certificates, 13 Silver and 26 Bronze.

Further Maths Course Leader David Neumann, who co-ordinates entries for both competitions said, "The competitions are a brilliant way of encouraging students to develop their love of Maths. Many of the students involved in this year's Challenges took the initiative to start their own Maths Club, which was a very satisfying outcome for the Maths Department!"

Chemistry Olympiad

16 students were awarded medals in the Royal Society of Chemistry's 2023 Chemistry Olympiad. The competition gives students a great opportunity to extend their critical problem-solving skills and test their knowledge in new, real-world situations.

Script-writing Success

Upper Sixth student Abigail Field was shortlisted from nearly 500 entries in the National Theatre's annual script-writing competition.

Abigail found out about the 'New Views Festival 2023' competition through the College's Playwriting Club, that's offered as part of the College's Enrichment Programme (see page 20). She said, "I was really proud of 'Schrodinger's Boys', the 30-minute play I submitted, and my success has made me feel far more assured as a writer."

Partnerships

The College's partnership and progression agreements with selected universities have assisted students in obtaining offers from top universities. Current partnerships include:

- University of Law: two scholarships available to students that meet certain widening participation criteria; progression events; annual College prize for achievement in Law.
- University of Creative Arts: UCA talks and workshops on careers in specific industries; bursary for Reigate College students towards the cost of their course.
- Reigate College students qualify for contextual offers from Bristol University, that are two grades lower than other applicants. Bristol is now regularly one of the College's most popular 'Russell Group' university choices.

Aspire Programme

The College's Aspire Programme is designed to help more able students apply successfully for courses at the most competitive universities (including Russell Group universities such as Oxbridge).

This is achieved through a combination of:

- An additional weekly tutorial with an Aspire tutor
- The opportunity to take additional qualifications such as an EPQ (see page 11)
- Specific enrichment activities such as Women in STEM, Debating Club,

Model United Nations, Creative Writing, Electronics Club

- Talks from visiting speakers
- The opportunity to participate in external events such as Corpus Christi Masterclasses. This is in addition to the support given to all students by the Careers Department (see page 26).

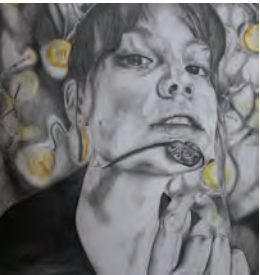

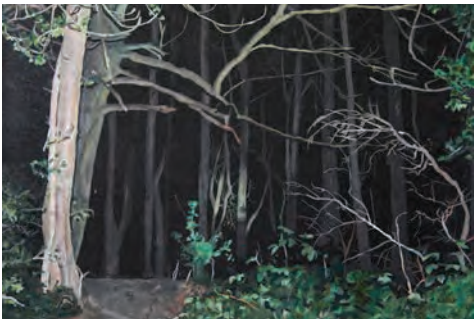

Medicine, Veterinary and Dentistry (MVD)

In total, 19 students received offers for Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry in 2023.

18 current students and 1 former student have obtained at least one offer:

- 13 offers for Medicine
- 5 offers for Veterinary Science
- 1 offer for Dentistry

Liz Sanders, Associate Director (Pathways), who runs the MVD Programme at the College explained, "Nationally, 16% of Medicine applications resulted in an offer in 2022, whereas, 85.7% of those applying from the Reigate College MVD Programme have secured at least one offer this year. So we're delighted to be bucking the national trend!"

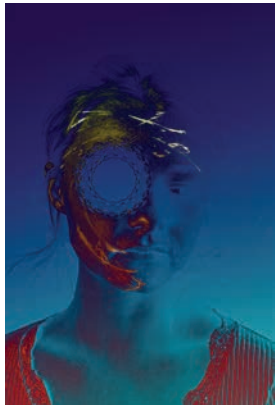

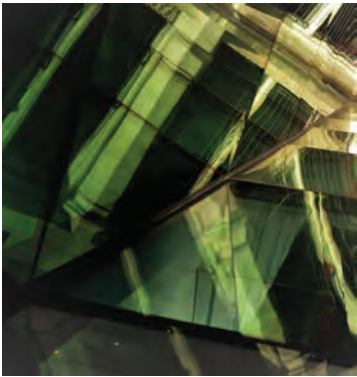

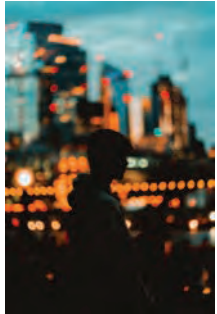

Extended Project Qualifications (EPQ)

Students on the College's Aspire Programme are invited to do an EPQ, as an additional qualification, from the beginning of their Lower Sixth.

The EPQ gives students the opportunity to explore an area of specific interest to them (as an extended essay, artefact or field study). The only requirement is that students select an area they are passionate about, as the qualification requires working

independently, in much the same way as is expected at university.

At the time of going to print, we were still awaiting the results for 2023, however in 2022:

- 68% of students received an A*-A
 - 88% of students received an A*-B

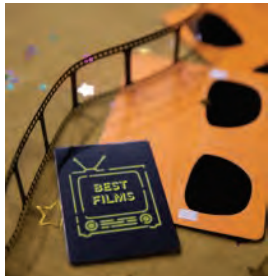
RAFTAs 2023

Careers

It's been another busy year for the Careers Department. As well as offering individual support and guidance, plus facilitating over 1,000 university applications, the Careers team has overseen a packed schedule of events and activities:

Parents' Information Meetings

- **15 September 2022:** UCAS Parents' Information Evening (Upper Sixth)
- **22 September 2022:** Apprenticeship and Employment Parents' Information Evening (Upper Sixth)
- **29 September 2022:** Welcome to Careers Parents' Information meeting (Lower Sixth)

These were virtual information evenings designed to explain how parents can support their sons/daughters/young people with general progression planning and university and apprenticeship applications.



Get Ahead Days (for Progression Planning)

- **9 February 2023:** Intermediate Higher Education (HE) and Careers Fair. This scaled down version of the Lower Sixth's event (see 21 March) is designed to support students who've done a year's Level 2 Programme (GCSE equivalent), who are not staying on for a Level 3 Programme (A Level equivalent).
- **21 March 2023:** Lower Sixth HE and Careers Fair with over 100 exhibitors from universities, gap year organisations and employers, plus a new Apprenticeships zone that included 14 large apprenticeship providers. The day also included one-to-one sessions with tutors and talks on applying for university and apprenticeships.

National Apprenticeship Week and Show

- **6-12 February 2023:** A programme of lunchtime talks for students in the Lower and Upper sixths, given by speakers from the College's Alumni, representing:
 - Fidelity International
 - RSM Accounting
 - Unilever
 - Waterman Engineering
- **1 March 2023:** Apprenticeship Show, Sandown Park. Over 150 Upper Sixth students took part in this annual event designed for

exploring a variety of apprenticeship opportunities.

Progression Day

- **20 June 2023:** A concentrated day of talks and activities for all Lower Sixth students. Talks covered: progression routes in different subject areas, how to write a personal statement and how to apply for apprenticeships.

Work Experience Week

- **10-14 July 2023:** All students are required to complete work experience in their Lower Sixth. 'Work Experience Week' is a designated week in the College timetable allocated for students to complete work experience. The week gives students the chance to take advantage of a range of opportunities arranged by the Careers team, including insight visits to local employers. During the week insight visits were organised with:

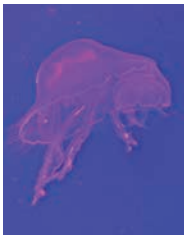

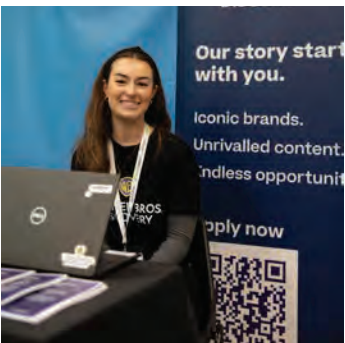

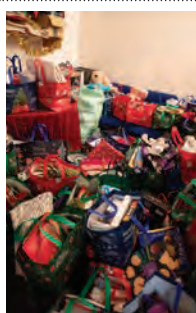
