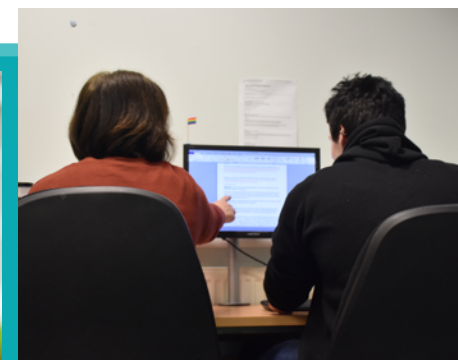

Learning Support Centre

Reigate College is committed to offering the very best learning support to its students and has a new, purpose-built Learning Support Centre situated on the first floor of 'Priory Building'.

This well-resourced centre run by a team of professionally trained staff is equipped with both small rooms designed for one-to-one and small group consultations and a large supported study area.

The College has an excellent record of recognising and addressing the needs of individual students, including those who've already had Learning Support in school and those whose needs only come to light while at College.

The Learning Support Centre provides a supportive and caring environment in which all students can thrive. Further information can be found in the Local Offer link on the Learning Support page of the College website.

The College's success with students is achieved by:

- » Giving specialist advice, guidance and support to students with Specific Learning Difficulties or with English as an Additional Language.
- » Mentoring individual students: giving them time and space to talk with experienced and understanding staff.
- » Investing in highly qualified and dedicated Learning Facilitators who work both alongside students in classrooms and by providing additional support outside of class.

- » Ensuring Learning Support Staff undergo continuous and comprehensive training on all aspects of learning difficulties.
- » Subject teachers, facilitators and specialist support staff working as a team, to ensure students' particular needs are fully appreciated and catered for in College.
- » Maintaining regular contact with parents or guardians, to discuss concerns regarding their son or daughter's progress on an on-going basis.
- » Assessing students whose literacy and underlying skills are adversely affecting their progress and implementing appropriate levels of support.
- » Encouraging students to develop their ability to work independently using a variety of techniques, including assisted technologies which are available for students to use.
- » Liaising closely with outside agencies e.g. Relate, Surrey CAMHS, Catch 22 and other support agencies for young people

Open from 9.00am to 4.15pm, term time only, the Learning Support Centre serves as the hub for the Learning Support Department and is staffed during these times by a specialist and friendly team of staff.
