Take a look at what's available in 2025-2026:

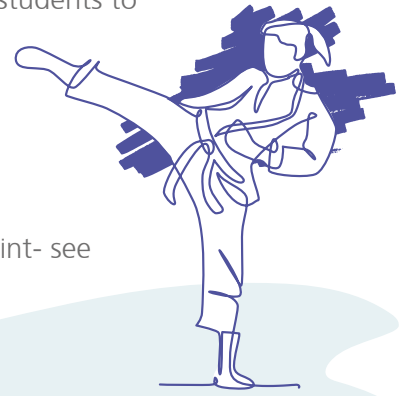
1 Clubs and Activities Programme

Sign up at the Activities Fair on 5 September.

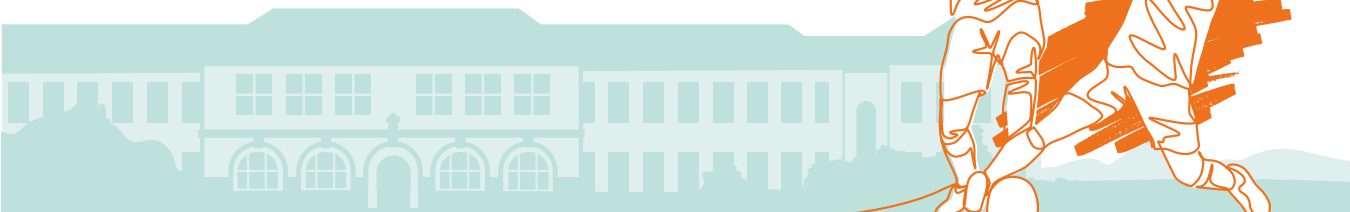


2 Competitive Sport

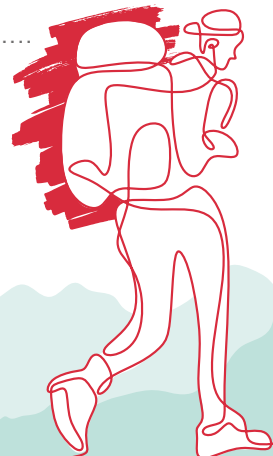

Students' Union (SU)

The SU is responsible for organising and running a whole variety of social and fundraising events as well as being a channel of communication between the student body and College Management.

SU events and activities form a big part of College life and have recently included: Freshers' and Leavers' events, swap shops (for clothes and books), 'Love Week' in February, 'Charity Week' in March, 'Menstruation Stations' (to highlight period poverty), cake sales, pop-up events such as hot chocolate give-aways, Film Nights, Gratitude Week, Green Week and Equality & Community Day.

You can apply for a role on the SU during the Spring Term of the Lower Sixth. Candidates are then interviewed and selected following consultation with relevant members of staff.
