## Interim Reports

The latest interim report will be available from 5pm tonight (Monday 8 June). You can access the report by logging onto the [Portal](#), clicking 'My Data' and 'Interim Report'. As a reminder, interim reports include:

- **Attitude & Behaviour to Learning** – Each subject is graded 4–1 (4 = Excellent, 1 = Unacceptable) across three areas: Independence, Class Ethic, and Deadlines. An average score is calculated for each subject.
- **Attendance** – Actual Attendance shows the % of lessons attended; Adjusted Attendance accounts for authorised absences.
- **Key Assessment** – This is the grade from the most substantial assessment this half term.
- **National Calculated Grade** – Predicted grade based on prior achievement and national data from the Department for Education.
- **Feedback & Action** – Students set actions to improve based on teacher feedback.

## Progress Exams and Predicted Grades

Students will receive their Progress Exams results on Monday 8 June and can view them on the Portal. For a minority of students, the results may not be what they were expecting. Staff will be meeting with these students over the following three weeks to identify strategies to support the student in the Upper Sixth. This will include Plus classes and Directed Study on timetables for next year and additional work to be undertaken over the summer to consolidate Lower Sixth learning.

Students can use the UCAS predictor in the Exams section on the Portal to work out predicted grades for A Level subjects. Predicted grades for A Level equivalent subjects such as BTECs, will be issued early in September once the results of external exams and assignment moderation are known. These predicted grades will be used for university applications. The grade for each subject is based on the Progress Exam and Key Assessment results and will also be confirmed on the Portal on **Monday 8 June** for A Level subjects. ## Interim Report 5

- The final student report of the year will be published on Monday, 8 June. Alongside grades for attitude and behaviour towards learning (graded 4–1), students taking A-level courses will also receive their Progress Exam Result and UCAS Predicted Grade.
- For students studying non-A-level courses (such as Criminology, BTECs, and AAQs) who sat external exams in May, no Key Assessment (KA) or UCAS Predicted Grades will be included. However, if a department chooses to report an internal assignment grade, a KA grade for that course will appear on the report.
- UCAS Predicted Grades for these non-A-level courses will be issued in early September once the results of external exams and any assignment moderation have been confirmed.

## BTEC and GCSE results

For students who took Level 3 non- A level external assessments in May, results will be available via the portal on Thursday 13 August 2026. For those taking GCSE English/Maths, results will be available on Thursday 20 August 2026. # Progression Day

This is a compulsory event that follows on from Get Ahead Day and takes place on Tuesday 16 June. Students will be sent their personalised timetables during the week of 8 June for the day. Students will have the opportunity to attend either a talk by a university on how to write a personal statement, or an employment and apprenticeship workshop, focussing on either creating a successful CV or interview preparation. The event will also include information about options for upper sixth pathways and opportunity for a 1:1 with their tutor.

# Introductory Days

On Wednesday 24 and Friday 26 June, we will be welcoming new students who are joining the College in September for their Introductory Day. As a result, there will be no lessons on these days, and current students will not be able to be on site. Teachers will provide structured learning tasks for students to complete at home.

# Textbook/equipment return

Students should return their one-year textbooks to the Ground Floor ILC Helpdesk as soon as they are no longer needed this term, with the final deadline of **Friday 3 July**. An email will be sent listing the titles each student must return. All books must be handed directly to ILC staff at the Helpdesk—returns left elsewhere or given to teachers may not be processed and could result in charges. # Equality and Community Day

Students will also be able to take part in a range of fun activities designed to bring everyone together. They will also consider protected characteristics through tutor-based activities and find out about local community projects that they can get involved with.

# Returning to College in September

All Upper Sixth students are required to attend on **Tuesday 1 September**. This important day will focus on progression planning, including post-college pathways, and will also include team-building and community activities. Students will also review their Lower Sixth work experience and set goals for the year ahead.

**Formal lessons will begin on Monday 7 September.** Students will be able to access their timetables via the College Portal over the weekend of **5 and 6 September**, and a copy will also be sent to their College email account.

Please remind your young person to **keep their Student ID card and lanyard safe** over the summer break, as these must be worn upon their return on **Tuesday 1 September**. Please note that lost ID cards are subject to a replacement fee.

## University Open Day Visit

Students intending to apply to university will be booking places on and attending open days over the coming weeks. A reminder that students can search for dates of open days using [opendays.com](http://opendays.com) or the universities' websites.

Most open days can be booked for Saturdays, but if students need to miss College, they should forward the email confirming their booking to [attendance@reigate.ac.uk](mailto:attendance@reigate.ac.uk) to request authorised absence. A maximum of five days' authorised absence in one academic year can be approved for activities to support progression such as open days, taster days or work experience. Students should also let their teachers know they will be missing lessons.

## Driving Lessons

Just a quick reminder that the college car park and drop-off area are for students, parents/carers, and college use only. We have noticed more driving instructors using these spaces to meet students for lessons, but this is not allowed. To help keep the area safe and accessible for everyone, please arrange lessons to start and finish away from the college site. Thank you for your support.

Students should now have arranged their in-person work experience. Any students that have not submitted work experience on to the portal by the end of June will need to come into college on the afternoon of Friday 26<sup>th</sup> June to complete online work experience with Springpod. They will be e mailed further information about this.
