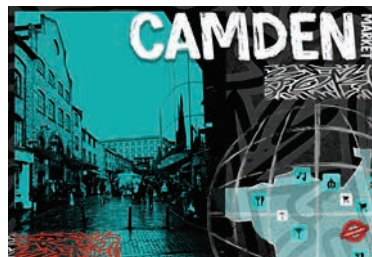

Summer Results Headlines 2025

Last summer, Reigate College students once again received outstanding A Level results with 61.1% achieving high grades A* to B and 83.7% achieving A* to C.

- 166 students received a clean sweep of all A or A* grades, for all three or four of their A Levels
- 80% of all students who applied, were offered places at their first-choice university, with 305 students gaining places at the most prestigious Russell Group universities
- 14 students took up places at Oxford or Cambridge
- 13 students had offers confirmed for Medicine or Veterinary Science, with 92% of those who completed the MVD Programme, gaining places at their first-choice university

For BTEC Level 3s

- 63% of all BTEC Extended Certificate grades (one A Level equivalent) resulted in high grades (Distinction or Distinction*)
- 100% of all students who did the triple in Performing Arts (3 A Level equivalent) achieved a high grade (Distinction or Distinction*)

Overall

- 85% of our students achieved at least one high grade (A*- B and Distinction* - Distinction)

Ofsted News

On receiving the outcome of April's Ofsted inspection, Reigate College's Principal, Nick Clark said, "I'm delighted to share the news that all eight areas of our recent Ofsted inspection were graded as 'Strong Standard', which is a phenomenal achievement. Whilst some schools and colleges may have one or two areas in total that reach this incredibly high benchmark, very few have achieved this across the entire provision."

Pat Frankland, Chair of Trustees, in an address to staff said, "We are all aware that it takes the efforts of all staff to achieve this result. The outcome is a reflection of not only your high standard of work, but your dedication too. Only with both, is it possible to achieve such a consistently high grade in every area."

In summarising what it's like to be a learner at the College, the report concluded, "Students enjoy their learning and thrive in the nurturing environment, where all feel welcomed, valued and supported. They are encouraged to be aspirational, achieve their goals and be who they want to be." Nick Clark said, "That sums up the College perfectly."

Aspire Programme

The College's Aspire Programme is designed to help students apply successfully for courses at the most competitive universities (including Russell Group universities such as Oxbridge). This is achieved through a combination of:

- An additional weekly tutorial in the Lower Sixth with an Aspire tutor
- The opportunity to take additional qualifications such as an Extended Project Qualification (see bottom right)
- Specific enrichment activities such as Women in STEM, Debating Club, Model United Nations, Creative Writing, Electronics Club

- Talks from visiting speakers
- The opportunity to participate in external events such as Corpus Christi Masterclasses.

All students can elect to be on the Aspire Programme.

Extended Project Qualification

The EPQ gives students the opportunity to explore an area of specific interest to them (as an extended essay, artefact or field study). The only requirement is they select an area they are passionate about, as the qualification requires working in an independent way, and so wanting to delve deeply into a specific topic is essential.

Some universities make a lower offer (usually a drop of a grade) for students who achieve an A or A* for their EPQ.

Some examples of research areas from the last cohort include: the ethics of gestational surrogacy, whether Universal Basic Income is a viable solution to solving poverty in the UK, the use of AI in tackling climate change and how far the Good Friday Agreement achieved its aims.

Interview with Livvy Thompson

Former Reigate School student Livvy Thompson reflects upon the benefit of doing the Aspire Programme and an EPQ and gives some insights into College life.



Which subjects did you choose?

I chose Physical Education, Psychology and Maths.

Tell us about the Aspire Programme

I did the Aspire Programme in my first year which was brilliant for helping me work out my future plans.

Through Aspire I had the chance to do an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), which was a big project to fit in around my other studies, but it was broken down into stages to complete at different times and my Aspire teacher was really helpful in supporting me through it.

The title I chose combined my interests in Sport and Psychology: How significant is the lack of physical activity in state-funded secondary schools as a contributing factor to the mental health crisis in young people? I know that by doing an EPQ I've learnt how to work independently, plan my own time and develop the kind of research skills that I know I'm going to need at university.

What have you liked most about being a student at Reigate College?

The independence. I've liked being able to schedule my own free time and fit my College work in around other things, such as my job, exercise and social life. I've learnt lots of new organisational skills and am much better at planning now.

What do you think makes Reigate College a good place to be a student?

There's something for everyone with so many extra-curricular clubs and activities to choose from. There's also a wide range of people, with different interests and different personalities, so it's possible for everyone to fit in at College.

What's your plan for when you leave College?

I have a conditional place to study Psychology at Newcastle University. I'm particularly interested in Developmental Psychology and would like to pursue a career path working with children and young people in the future.

Widening Participation

Our Aspire students have gained places on a range of programmes that support students applying to competitive universities from under-represented (widening participation) backgrounds.

These have included: Pathway to Bath, Oxford University's UNIQ Access Programme, the Social Mobility Foundation's Aspiring Professionals Programme, the Lucy Cavendish Applicant Support (Cambridge) and Zero Gravity.

Other students are taking part in residential at various universities and Oxbridge colleges over the summer.

Several have entered essay competitions including those run by Peterhouse College, Cambridge for Biological Sciences, and St Hugh's Oxford for History.

Partnerships

The College's partnership and progression agreements with selected universities have assisted students in obtaining offers from top universities.

Current partnerships include:



● University of Exeter: Partners Scheme provides support with applications and guarantees offers for non-capped courses

● University of Law: two scholarships available to students that meet certain widening participation criteria; progression events



● University of Creative Arts: talks and workshops on careers in specific industries; bursary for Reigate College students towards the cost of their course

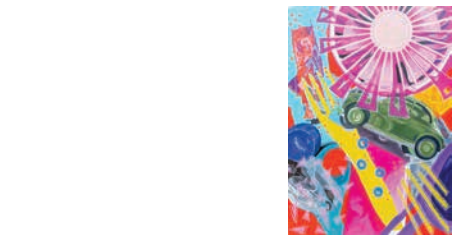


● University of Portsmouth: a range of support and a contextual offer and bursary scheme for students who meet certain widening participation criteria

We're proud to introduce just eight of this year's talented cohort and to give you a glimpse at some of their final year pieces.

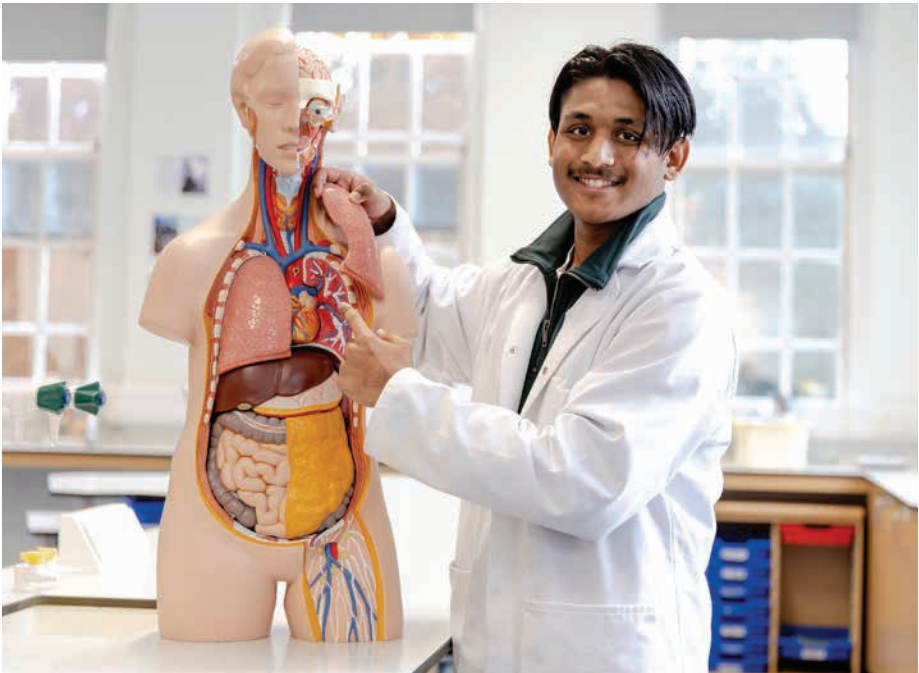
Medicine, Veterinary Science and Dentistry (MVD)

Year 8 MVD Introductory Session

45 Year 8 students from seven of the College's partner schools attended an after school session aimed at students on a GCSE average flightpath of 7+. Titled "Do you want to be a Doctor, Dentist or Vet?" Liz shared her advice about which Science options to take at GCSE, and the importance of volunteering and getting involved in extracurricular activities.

Year 10 MVD Taster Programme

This 4-week after school programme that ran in January and February was attended by 22 students from five of the College's partner schools. It covered what a MVD career might involve and what essential skills are needed to be successful.

Year 11 MVD Event for Applicants

The College's MVD Event for Applicants held on 25 March was aimed at Year 11 students who are interested in a career in Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry, and have chosen Chemistry and Biology at A Level, with a predicted average GCSE score of 7 or above.

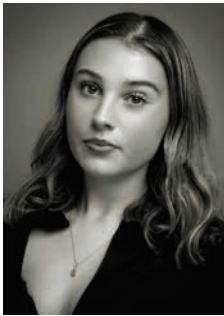

RAFTAs 2026

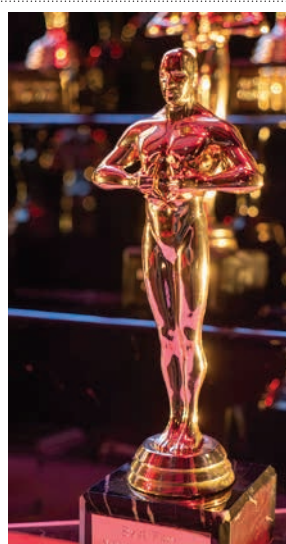

Career Pathways update

Nearly 2500 students were supported with their progression plans on one of the College's 23 Career Pathways this year, from Maths to Visual Arts. The Pathways are delivered by specialist teachers, involve an extra hour on the timetable each week and aid entry into specific professions and/or further study.

Pathways are selected at Enrolment but can be changed at the end of the Autumn Term, which allows students to settle into their subjects. Students then either continue their pathway into the Upper Sixth or choose a new one if their career plans have shifted.

All pathways, except for Careers in Health, MVD and Oxbridge, started in the Spring Term of the Lower Sixth. We also ran five additional courses: Carbon Literacy; Digital Skills; Emergency First Aid; Greek; and Oracy, some of which resulted in formal qualifications.

Pathways into Work

This year saw a significant evolution in how the College's Apprenticeship and Employment (App & Emp) Pathway is delivered. At its heart is a progressive, stage-based model that supports learners as they move from awareness to making an application and ultimately, job readiness.

Students choosing the App & Emp Pathway have an additional weekly tutorial added to their timetable with the College's Head of Careers Advice and Employability, Carolyn Langford. These structured group sessions focus on key skills development, including contemporary issues like the use of ethical AI tools to enhance applications.

During the last academic year, three cohorts took part, each attending sessions for an eight week period. Cohort timings reflected real-world recruitment timelines:

for example, Degree Apprenticeships are the first to open, so this cohort started in September while the other two kicked off in November and February.

The practical nature of delivery together with insights into what employers are looking for helps learners take immediate, tangible steps towards employment.

The Pathway will continue to evolve based on student feedback, with greater support for mock interview practice and networking skills at the top of the list.

Feedback showed students grew in: confidence, particularly with CV and application writing; understanding their own personal skills and values; navigating apprenticeship and job searches; and understanding recruitment and selection processes.
